CAS Cheat Sheet

A. CAS Definitions

Creativity: arts, and other experiences that involve creative thinking or production in some measureable sense (event planning, formulation of a club, stage crew, scrap booking, debate performance)

Action: physical exertion contributing to a healthy lifestyle, complementing academic work elsewhere in the Diploma *Programme* (sports, an exercise program, karate, planting a garden, weight loss)

Service: an unpaid and voluntary exchange that has a learning benefit for the student but for which the rights, dignity, and the autonomy of all those involved are respected (hospital volunteering, participating in a cancer walk)

B. Politics and Religion

- 1. Recognize that the goal is to provide a service for others, not superimpose one's values on others
- 2. Refrain from proselytizing as any part of service to others or counting hours as part of one's worship
- 3. Avoid exclusively serving (in) one's religious community

C. Requirements for Completion of CAS:

- 1. a minimum of 150 completed hours
- 2. a balance of at least 50 hours in each category: creativity, action, service
- 3. a reasonably sustained, uninterrupted CAS programme lasting eighteen months
- 4. at least one extended project, spanning four months or thirty total hours:
 - A. be of significant duration (stretching 4 months or at least 30 hours in length)
 - B. be collaborative (either with UAIS students or people in the community)
 - C. involve two of the three CAS components (creativity, action, and/or service)
 - D. culminate in a significant event, presentation, performance, or product
- 5. evidence of meeting each of the eight learning outcomes at least once each:
 - A. increased their awareness of their own strengths and areas of growth.
 - B. undertaken new challenges.
 - C. planned and initiated activities.
 - D. worked collaboratively with others.
 - E. shown perseverance and commitment in their activities.
 - F. engaged with issues of global importance.
 - G. considered the ethical implications of their actions.
 - H. developed new skills.
- 6. one reflection (min. 150 words) logged for every ten hours of CAS, and one reflection minimum for each activity

D. Consequences for Lack of Reflections

- 1. verbal warning
- 2. verbal warning and contact to parent
- 3. instigation of CAS essays found on uaiscas.com website to be turned in at completion of activity

E. Meeting Responsibilities

- 1. Log a meeting
- 2. Click the appropriate red/green flag or medal for update to coordinator
- 3. Approve activities only with supervisor form or agreement between advisor/student for documentation
- 4. Complete activities only after discussing/reviewing reflections & supervisor review proving completion has been sent
- 5. Always be mindful of the extended project
- F. Quality of Activities: CAS activities are always challenging, collaborative, achievable, and goal-oriented.
